







Comparing corn

Instructions for comparing corn in terms of size

1. Give out worksheet and kernels to students.
2. Take two kernels, e.g. a popped kernel and a dried kernel.
3. Ask students which kernel is bigger.
4. Ask students to locate the pair of kernels being compared on their worksheets.
5. In the middle column, ask students to draw the bigger of the two kernels. You may also have them draw the smaller of the two kernels to practice the concept of small/smaller.
6. Let students work on the rest of the worksheet.
7. When all students have completed their worksheets, go over all the pairings.
8. Then ask students to fill out the last row with the smallest kernel to the left and the biggest kernel to the right.

Follow the same instructions for comparing corn in terms of weight, appearance and color.
